
Plaintiffs respectfully state that OPDC is suffering immediate and irreparable harm
 because it has failed its third test for coliform levels for its raw cream products made from raw
 milk. Because of this third failure, Plaintiff OPDC has been ordered by CDFA to immediately
 stop the sale of its dairy cream made from raw milk and is losing \$10,000 per week in lost sales
 of cream.

Both plaintiffs anticipate they will soon fail three out of five tests for raw whole milk and
or skim milk or cream because of their inability to comply with the coliform requirements of AB
1735. Plaintiffs believe that this failure to comply with the coliform requirements of AB 1735
will cause them immediate and irreparable harm because upon a third failure they will be ordered
by CDFA to stop the sale of raw milk, which is their principal business. Plaintiffs believe this
third failure will occur during the month of March 2008.

Plaintiffs incorporate by reference herein the citations to law and fact contained in their
complaint and in their Motion and Memorandum in Support of a Preliminary Injunction as a
Memorandum in Support of this Temporary Restraining Order.

Plaintiffs request leave to file a supplemental memorandum in support of its motion in
advance of the hearing in this matter.
