Peter,

Thank you for your askFSIS questions.

You state and ask:

- Q1. Under 9 CFR 303.1 how many owners can you have for a custom slaughtered animal if the animal is slaughtered on the farm by a state-licensed custom mobile slaughterer?
- A1. No limit. On farm slaughter by a "mobile" slaughter operation is covered by requirements in 9 CFR 303.1(a)(2). The regulations allow for more than one owner of livestock provided that the "ownership" (i.e. all owners) of the animal is clearly demonstrated and documented prior to the slaughter of the animal. Obviously, the same owners would receive the custom processed product based on such ownership.
- Q2. Under 9 CFR 303.1, can the farmer act as the agent for the actual livestock owner or owners and arrange for the custom mobile slaughterer to come to the farm and slaughter the animal?
- A2. Yes. The custom exempt regulations are silent regarding the farmer acting as a livestock agent. The Livestock handler's regulation (9 CFR 320.1) does require the farmer to completely and correctly disclose the nature of the transaction in his record. The new owner would have a copy of the transaction as well.

pick up product from the processor on behalf of the owner and deliver to the owner.

Q3. If the carcass from that animal is taken to custom facility for processing, can the farmer act as the agent for the actual owners and pick up the meat from the facility and distribute it to the actual owners?

A3. Yes, the regulations authorize the custom operator to deliver such product to the owners as part of his fee for service. However, as a separate transaction or as part of the original sale, the farmer (previous livestock owner) can deliver product to the new owners on behalf of the new owners. It would be wise that the custom processor have evidence (i.e. documentation) the farmer is authorized by the owners to
